



## **BILINGUAL EDUCATION FACILITATORS**

Birth for Humankind is seeking up to six women to work as casual Bilingual Education Facilitators.

### **Who is Birth for Humankind?**

Birth for Humankind is a not-for-profit organisation based in Melbourne. We provide free pregnancy and birth support sessions and group education to women who are experiencing social and financial hardship.

### **Who are we looking for?**

In 2019, Birth for Humankind is running group education sessions in the City of Yarra. We are looking for bilingual women to help review our resources and work as casual facilitators to deliver training to other women from their community.

This project is funded by the City of Yarra.

Eligibility criteria:

- Bicultural (competent in English and either Arabic, Persian, Oromo or Vietnamese)
- Live in the City of Yarra
- Be passionate about supporting pregnant women and new mothers
- Have (or be willing to complete) a Police Check and Working with Children Check

### **Our education sessions**

We are running a series of education sessions on 'Navigating the Australian Maternal Health System', to be delivered by bilingual facilitators to other women from their communities. The sessions aim to inform participants about where and how to access birth support, their rights, responsibilities and choices they have around labour and birth.

### **Key dates and responsibilities**

- 1) Resource Review sessions – Develop, review and adapt learning resources for education program.  
2 x 3 hour sessions to be held in late May. Dates to be confirmed with interested women.
- 2) Co-facilitation training – Learn how to deliver education sessions to other women.  
2 x 3 hour sessions to be held in June. Dates to be confirmed with interested women.
- 3) Session co-facilitation – Sessions will be delivered in venues across Yarra City Council.  
6 x 1 hour sessions between July-October. Dates and venues to be confirmed.
